Declaring November 18th, 2021 as World Pancreatic Cancer Day in the Town of New Glasgow.

WHEREAS Pancreatic Cancer is the third leading cause of cancer related death in Canada with a mortality rate of 92%;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer has the lowest survival rate of all major cancers, and just 2 to 10 percent of those diagnosed survive five years;

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer can strike anyone, regardless of age, gender or circumstances, and

WHEREAS pancreatic cancer has had minimal advancements in the last 40 years;

WHEREAS the good health and well-being of the residents of New Glasgow are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about the risks and symptoms of pancreatic cancer, and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments;

WHEREAS Craig's Cause Pancreatic Cancer Society is a Canadian charitable society dedicated to both increasing survival and improving the quality of life for every Canadian diagnosed with pancreatic cancer, through awareness raising, education, support and research.
